






#### **Updates**

The registry now houses over 900 cases of pediatric glaucoma from over 20 sites internationally! We also have over 15 sites currently in the process of joining, We are always looking to add more sites from all across the world. Please reach out to me if you or someone you know is interested in joining!

The Registry is an international centralized secure de-identified website database of childhood glaucoma hosted at the University of Rochester, with the intent of fostering research on pediatric glaucoma. Patient data can be entered from anywhere in the world and any site worldwide is welcome to join. There is no charge to join. After entering 10 patients, individual sites have access to the entire registry for their IRB approved research. Researchers retain all authorship on any papers arising from the data. It is a "win-win" for all!





### **Registry Coordinator**


#### Kinza Abbas
